All students, regardless of religious affiliation, are required to attend the two weekly Seton Masses.

We will be pleased to accept your Application for Admission, and will administer the Seton Entrance Exam to all qualified applicants. **However, Seton is currently near maximum enrollment and we anticipate few, if any, openings in grades 8, 10, and 12 for the 2019-2020 school year.** If you apply for grades 8, 10, and/or 12, please do not be surprised if your child is wait-listed, no matter how well qualified he or she is. We just do not have space to accept everyone who applies. Thank you for understanding.

If you wish to apply to Seton, return the completed Application for Admission with the non-refundable \$125.00 (per child) application fee. On the back of the application form indicate your preferred Entrance Exam date. We encourage you to consider the earlier test dates as they are generally less crowded. After we receive your application and application fee, our Admissions Coordinator, will contact you to confirm the Entrance Exam date for your son/daughter. All Entrance Exam dates must be confirmed. We do not accept walk-ins.

## Admissions Requirements and Procedures

### Statement of Policy

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### Requirements

All applicants must return the Application Form and fee, take the Seton Entrance Exam, and follow the report card guidelines listed below. Applications will be posted at [www.setonschool.net](http://www.setonschool.net) under "Admissions" on September 1, 2018.

### **Applications will be accepted between Monday, September 3, 2018, and Monday, December 3, 2018**

*Students will not be tested unless an Admissions Application has been received and the testing date confirmed.  
"Walk-ins" will not be accepted.*

### Procedures

- I. Application Form** - Complete and return the Application for Admission along with a \$125.00 non-refundable application fee for each applicant. Remember to indicate your preferred Entrance Exam date (*see inset below for date options*) in the space provided on the back of the application. Upon receipt of your completed Application for Admission and fee, you will receive a confirmation email from the Admissions Coordinator, Mrs. Julie Mantooth, to confirm the Entrance Exam date for your son/daughter. Please notify the school in writing if you have a change of address, or in the event you find you must withdraw your application.
  
- II. Entrance Exam Components** - The Seton Entrance Exam consists of a general knowledge test, a written composition, and an interview with one of our faculty members. The length of the entrance exam varies depending on the number of students present. Dates for placement tests for high school level math and foreign languages will be announced in the spring. *Current Seton families are requested to schedule incoming siblings for the October or November Entrance Exam dates if possible.*

*Modest attire is required for students taking the entrance exam. Jeans, shorts, and hoodies are prohibited.  
Students will not be tested unless an admissions application has been received and the testing date is confirmed.*

### **ENTRANCE EXAM DATES**

**December 8, 2018      January 4, 2019 (inclement weather date)**

**Please arrive at 9:45 a.m. Testing begins promptly at 10:00 a.m.**

**Your test date must be scheduled in advance. Walk-ins are not accepted.**

**III. Report Card/Transcripts** - Applicants for Grades 7-9 must submit a copy of their first semester or most recent report card on or before February 1, 2019. Applicants for Grades 10-12 **must supply a complete high school transcript (unofficial copy is acceptable) on or before February 1, 2019**. Final acceptance is contingent upon your child's official transcripts from any school previously attended, including formal and informal home-schooling programs, being received by Seton School by Monday, July 1, 2019.

**IV. Notification** - Letters of acceptance and non-acceptance will be mailed on **Friday, March 1, 2019**. Please do not call the school. All notification will be made via mail.

**V. Registration Deposit** - Within 2 weeks of acceptance, a \$230.00 enrollment fee per student is required to confirm your decision to send your child/ren to Seton. It is not refundable should you decide to withdraw your child/ren's application/s. If the deposit is not received within 2 weeks, the child/ren's name/s will be removed from the acceptance list.

### **Open House**

Families interested in Seton are strongly encouraged to attend our Open House for parents and prospective students. The Open House provides an excellent opportunity to learn about the philosophy and academic standards of Seton School. Following the formal presentation, visitors will meet our faculty, tour the school, talk with families of current students, and attend "mini-classes" in several subject areas. The Seton Open House will take place at the Corpus Christi Building across from Seton School. The Corpus Christi Building and Seton School will be available for tours.

**Open House: Sunday, November 4, 2018**

**2:00 - 4:00 p.m.**

**Formal Presentation begins at 2 PM. Mini classes will follow the presentation.**

### **Tours and School Visits**

You and/or your child (ren) may wish to visit Seton and attend classes for a day or part of the day. School visits may be arranged by appointment only. We will arrange for one of our students to welcome your child and be with him or her through the day. Contact the school to arrange a tour or a visit at least one week in advance of the day you would like your appointment.
