HOLY HOUR TONIGHT: Tonight 7:00-8:00 there is a Holy Hour at All Saints to pray for the victims of abuse and for the healing of the Church.

HUMANAЕ VITAE, 50TH ANNIVERSARY: We have seen that Christians universally believed that contraception was a violation of marriage and an offense against God. So what happened? There were many factors, but a major factor in the United States was Margaret Sanger and her Birth Control Society (forerunner of Planned Parenthood). Sanger was a racist, anti-Semite, anti-Catholic, and eugenicist. She believed that persons who had genetic disorders or who were "feeble-minded" (her term) should not be allowed to have children. She once said that 70 per cent of the people she saw walking down the street were feeble-minded. Sanger also promoted contraception in order to be promiscuous without consequences. She once referred to marriage as slavery and advocated replacing marriage with "voluntary associations," of which she had many. Planned Parenthood today will say that Sanger cared for the poor. She did not, referring to them as, among other things, "a dead weight of human waste." The pro-contraception movement did not arise from healthy or wholesome roots. A thoroughly documented book on Margaret Sanger is *Margaret Sanger, Father of Modern Society* by Elsie Drogin. When asked why she chose that title, Mrs. Drogin replied, "I'm certainly not going to call her a mother." There are numerous other sources available revealing the truth about Sanger and the origins of Planned Parenthood.






SUMMER READING REWARDS ANNOUNCED

In its first year, the Summer Reading Rewards Program at Seton had 67 participants with 643 books reported read. The purpose of the program was to promote reading, which has its own rewards of skill, knowledge, understanding and enjoyment. Reading is essential to education and to the life of an informed and well-formed adult. We thank the parents who encourage their students and congratulate all student readers!

In the Junior High School, students who read 3 or more books in addition to required summer reading received candy for each book. Cards for each book also were entered into a drawing. In Grade 7, \$5 prizes from the drawing were won by Madelyn Zadnik, Teresa Kelly, and Anneliese Orr. In Grade 8, \$5 prizes were won by Moira Haggerty, Fran Terreri, and Amelie Halisky.

In the Senior High School, students who read 3 extra books received ice cream treats. If a student read 5 or more, cards for each book were entered into drawings for prizes of \$20 for each grade level. Prizes went to Lily Byers, Grade 9; Annie Stevens, Grade 10; Gabriella Miller, Grade 11; and Sebastian O'Keefe, Grade 12.


