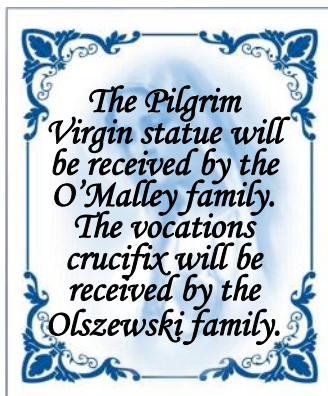

LET US LIVE THIS LENT WITH MARY: A suffering world, a suffering Church. Our society has gone far from God. The Church, being in the world, will suffer the consequences. At the beginning of this school year, we encouraged prayer and penance in reparation for the sins of the clergy and for healing. Now, as Lent begins, is a good time to renew our commitment to praying and sacrificing for our Church. We are not in a position to make major changes in our society or our Church, but we can change ourselves, our families, and our school.

This Lent, I propose that we focus on Mary, Mother of God and Mother of the Church, beginning, renewing, or strengthening our devotion to her as a means of coming closer to Jesus. Each week during Lent, the Sentinel will offer a reflection to bring us to a deeper understanding of Mary's role in the Church and in the world and to encourage us to grow in love of Jesus through Mary. This week we will consider why we should come to Jesus through Mary.

Beginning in the late 1960's and continuing through the 1970's and beyond, there was a decline in devotion to Mary. It is no coincidence that so many problems in the Church began at this time. But St. John Paul II throughout his pontificate sought to restore Mary to her proper role. God chose to enter the world through a woman. He could have chosen to become incarnate as a fully grown man, but instead He came as an infant. Jesus spent thirty years of His life with His mother. She helped Him inaugurate His public life through His first miracle at Cana, and she stood by Him at the foot of the Cross.

At a homily on the anniversary of his miraculous survival of the attempt to assassinate him, St. John Paul said that we must stand by Mary at the foot of the Cross to receive an outpouring of merciful love from the pierced Heart of Jesus. This mercy is “infinitely superior to the whole range of evil in man and the world.” Mary knows the power of God’s mercy “more than any other heart in the whole universe,” because she has received His mercy more than anyone else. Thus we should “accept her motherly help to return to the source of Redemption.” (The quotes from John Paul are taken from Father Michael Gaitley’s *The Second Greatest Story Ever Told*.)



Think of a way you and your family can “accept her motherly help” this Lent and thus open yourselves more fully to God’s mercy and be a channel of that mercy to the world around you. This Lent is an excellent time to begin praying the family Rosary if you are not already doing so. If the entire Rosary seems too much for you right now, then begin with a decade. Go to Jesus through Mary, and Jesus will come to you through her.
