### GROWING IN THE SPIRITUAL LIFE:

#### This week's topic: **Devotion to the Sacred Heart**

At this week's Friday Mass, we will renew our school's consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The Sacred Heart devotion is not optional. Some devotions are optional—like wearing a Miraculous Medal or praying to St. Jude or to St. Anthony (though some of us constantly need St. Anthony!). But the Sacred Heart is a sign of Jesus' great love for us and His desire for our love in return, which is not optional.

The Scriptural basis of devotion to the Sacred Heart is found in St. John's Gospel, 19:31-37. "When they came to Jesus and saw that He was already dead, they did not break His legs. One of the soldiers thrust a lance into His side, and immediately blood and water flowed out." Blood and water are symbols of His love and symbols of the two great sacraments of Baptism and Holy Eucharist. These sacraments represent the Church, the Bride of Christ. Just as Adam's side was opened and his bride Eve came forth, so Jesus' side is opened and His bride the Church comes forth.

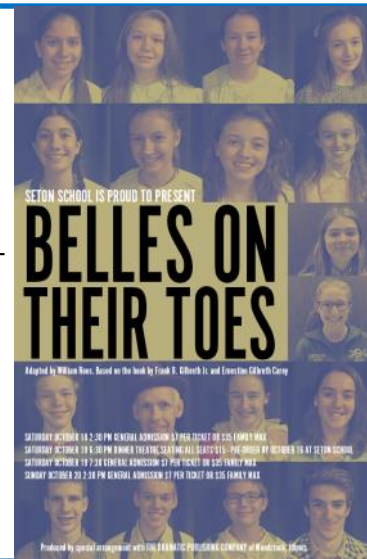

 **DOES TEST PREP IMPROVE SAT SCORES?**

Mrs. Stephanie Reyes, who administers the PSAT and SAT tests at Seton, answers, "Yes. College Board said for decades that test prep didn't work for increasing SAT scores. But having been a college admissions counselor in the mid-90s (University of Michigan) and seeing hundreds (probably thousands) of students' scores and seeing them get a higher test score the second time they took it (after studying for it and prepping) convinced me otherwise. Students would be deferred after the first review and then get higher test scores later and consequently be admitted."

Now, the College Board has changed its tune on test prep. Reyes says, "Fast forward to just a couple of years ago, and College Board now states: 'When it comes to improving scores, a little practice goes a long way. A study of 250,000 students from the class of 2017 showed that Official SAT Practice can help any student improve their scores—regardless of gender, race, income, or high school GPA. In fact, 20 hours on Khan Academy [a free online SAT prep program associated with the College Board] was associated with an average 115-point increase from the PSAT/MSQT to the SAT.' "

So yes, practice for the SAT can improve scores significantly, and it does not have to be expensive. If using Khan Academy works, why not try it? Says Mrs. Reyes, "Sometimes a 115 point change can make a big difference in merit-based scholarships. Say if 20 hours of 'work' prepping translated into an additional \$4,000/year scholarship (\$16,000 for 4 years), that's a pretty good hourly 'wage'."
