**MEDITATION FOR THE SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING, SUNDAY, NOV. 24** (from "Quas Primus" by Pope Pius XI: The "foundation of this power and dignity of Our Lord is rightly indicated by Cyril of Alexandria. "Christ," he says, "has dominion over all creatures, a dominion not seized by violence nor usurped, but his by essence and by nature." His kingship is founded upon the ineffable hypostatic union. From

this it follows not only that Christ is to be adored by angels and men, but that to him as man angels and men are subject, and must recognize his empire; by reason of the hypostatic union Christ has power over all creatures. But a thought that must give us even greater joy and consolation is this; that Christ is our King by acquired, as well as by natural right, for he is our Redeemer. Would that they who forget what they have cost their Savior might recall the words: "You were not redeemed with corruptible things, but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb unspotted and undefiled." [I Peter 1:18-19] Christ has purchased us "with a great price"; [I Cor. 6-20] our very bodies are the "members of Christ." [I Cor. 6:15]



**GROWING IN THE SPIRITUAL LIFE: This week's topic: The Holy Eucharist (continued)**

The seventh miracle is the presence of the Blessed Trinity on our altars. The Father and Holy Spirit are present along with the Son, just as they were present with Jesus Christ during His earthly existence. The great acts of generation of the Son and spiration of the Holy Spirit occur as we gaze upon what appears to be only a tiny piece of bread.

The eighth miracle is the manner in which Our Lord's body is present under the accidents of bread and wine. He is present wholly and entirely in even the smallest particle of the Sacred Host or the tiniest drop of the Precious Blood. If a person has an allergy to wheat and must receive Holy Communion under the species of wine only, he still receives Jesus entirely. If Hosts must be broken because of the large number of communicants, the faithful also receive Jesus in full.

The ninth miracle is the multiplicity of His presence. No matter how many Masses are being said at the same time, Jesus is truly present in each one. He is present just as truly in an army field Mass said on the hood of a jeep as He is present on the high altar of St. Peter's when the Pope celebrates Mass.

The tenth miracle is the restitution of the vanished substances when the accidents are corrupted or changed so that they are no longer recognizable as accidents of bread and wine; for example, during digestion. Thus, Our Lord is truly physically present with us for some time after Holy Communion, so that we become living tabernacles. We must use that time after Communion well, pouring out our love to Jesus dwelling intimately with us.

The eleventh miracle is the withdrawal of the Body of Christ from the accidents when they begin to corrupt. We should feel a pang of loss but also resolve to call His spiritual presence to mind often throughout the day. We should frequently say thank you for this Holy Communion and begin to prepare for the next one. In fact, each Mass should be a thanksgiving for the previous Holy Communion and a preparation for the next, so that our whole life is centered on the Holy Eucharist.

The twelfth miracle is not technically a miracle in the same sense as the first eleven. Rather it is what the theologians call a moral miracle—a great example of God's love for us. This last miracle is the ease and frequency with which we can receive Holy Communion. If Jesus had told us that once, just once, in our lives we could receive Him, and as preparation we would have to study theology for years, do intense penances, and spend months in prayerful retreat, we would have thought that a small price to pay for such a great gift. But instead, He allows us to receive Him every single day (or even twice a day, if the second time is at a full Mass which we are attending), with the only requirements being that we are baptized Catholics, in the state of grace, and fasting for one hour. What an outpouring of generosity; what a gift of love!
