

# Seton School Class Scheduling Form GUIDE for Rising Freshman

Welcome to High School! This form will be new to you but you will get comfortable with it since it will be similar for the rest of your time at Seton. Put your name and grade on the form.

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## **Religion**

Check WANT for Religion 9. If you plan to homeschool Religion 9 or any other class listed, please make a note of this in the Note field provided. All homeschool courses need to be approved by the Department Head. See the handbook for what is required.

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## **English**

Check WANT for Grammar 9 and English 9. If you would like to test out of Grammar 9, please indicate this on the form and mark the courses you would want to take if you test out. Mrs. Mirus will be getting in touch with you since she administers and grades this test. Please note that you will not get credit for this class and you will be required to take the vocab tests. Please wait on selecting any electives until you get through the entire form.

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## **Social Studies**

Most freshman take World History I, some take World History II. You are not eligible for any other Social Studies classes as a freshman. Since you need 3 Social Studies classes for graduation, we advise you to take WHI.

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## **Mathematics**

All freshman need to take a math class. Please mark those courses you've taken and select the next course you're eligible for. If you have homeschooled a math course, please let us know in the note field. Per our handbook, if you homeschooled a math class you need to take our final exam in that subject area to receive credit and to move onto the next level of math. Please contact Mr. Scheetz at [pscheetz@setonschool.net](mailto:pscheetz@setonschool.net) to setup a date/time to take the exam. You will not be allowed to move to the next level if you have not met these requirements. In addition, a 77%+ average is required in the previous level to proceed to the next level; students that receive below a 77% can complete remedial work during the summer. Mr. Scheetz is the Math Department head and can help answer your questions.

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## **Science**

3 science credits are required for graduation. If you have not taken Algebra I or struggle in math, Dr. Carpenter, our Science Department Head, advises you to wait to take Biology. You can select Earth and Space Science instead if you want to take a science your freshman year (Please note: This class is different than the Earth Science class you may have taken in 7<sup>th</sup> grade. It is a High School level class and the one in 7<sup>th</sup> grade is not). Biology requires students to participate in the Science Fair so only students that are strong in Math and English should take Biology as a freshman.

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## **Foreign Languages**

Indicate if you have taken any foreign language. All students need to take Latin I but some wait until Senior year. Since you need to take 2 years of the same foreign language, it is important to take these classes concurrently to maintain continuity. So, please keep this in mind when you make your choices.

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## **Fine Arts and Electives**

This is the area where we don't require you to take a certain elective; however, all students will have to take some electives to meet the 26 credits required for graduation. Go back and count how many classes you have signed up for thus far in the WANT column. All students need 7 classes for a full course load. If your count is at 6, then you have one elective to choose from. This elective can come from this Fine Arts section, Speech, Computers, or any other area. Mark the elective you want and next to it put a 1 in the choice line. Now go and find a few more and number them in choice order. If your count is already at 7, then still go back and mark some elective choices you would want in case you have a conflict with one of the classes you have picked. **It is so important that we know what you want in case you don't get your first choice.** If you have a conflict and you did not give us any choices, we will pick one for you.

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## **Sign, Save, and Email**

Have your parents look over your choices and sign the form (they can type in their name in the box provided), note any special requests or comments in the area provided or in the specific Note section of each subject area. If you would like to setup a phone meeting with Mrs. Montavon, please check the box provided to request a meeting.
