### **Morning Announcements**

- Made every morning to students. Announcements must be submitted by 6<sup>th</sup> period of the previous day.

### **Parent Resource Organization (PRO) Meetings**

- Held a couple of times a year as announced
- Program includes updates on information from the PRO Board and Mrs. Carroll/Mr. Pennefather
- Features: A guest speaker (10-15 min), prize drawings, refreshments and socializing

### **Snow Policy**

- If inclement weather is pending the next day, Seton will make an announcement via JupiterEd by 8 pm. If the weather worsens overnight, an updated announcement will be made via JupiterEd by 6 am that day.
- For delayed openings, Seton classes begin at 9:30 a.m. If a late opening occurs on a Monday Mass, classes will begin at 9:30 a.m, but students are not required to attend Mass on such days.
- If Seton is in session and weather becomes inclement, Seton will never close early. Parents are welcome to pick up their student OR call to give permission to let their student drive home.

### **Mercy Hours**

- All students must complete them each semester
- Grades 7-11 need 5 hours/semester; Grade 12 needs 10 hours/semester
- Includes- Altar serving, singing in Choir, babysitting free for religious class, Nursing Home visits, St. Nick's Carnival. Opportunities may be announced in Sentinel (ex. Operation Care Package, Feeding Homeless Super Bowl Sun)

### Exams- Mid terms

- Religion mid term: Monday, December 14th, 9:30 - 11:30 am
- Other mid terms: January 7<sup>th</sup> - 14<sup>th</sup> from 9:30 - 11:00 am
- Some classes may let students stay over to finish an exam, so coordinate a time with your student for pick up.

### Exams- Finals (May 26 - June 4, 9:30-11:30 am)

- One exam given each day for 7 days
- 5th and 6th on same day as lunch/ Religion
- Some classes let students stay over to finish exam, so coordinate a time with your student for pick up.

### Spirit Ad Campaign

- Seton's largest fundraiser is the Ad Campaign booklet for the Spring Musical - which kicks off in January. Seton families sell Ads that are printed in the playbook.
- ALL Seton families are expected to participate and raise \$375.
- The families who choose not to sell ads will be required to pay the \$375. More information can be found on Seton's website in the fall.

### Seton Dances

- Clubs usually host a dance 1x a month.
- Taking a date is only for Enthronement and Prom, and not all students come with an escort to those dances.
- Dance are high school students only except for the Cystic Fibrosis Dance.
- All dances are chaperoned with strict times for drop off and pick up
- Only currently enrolled Seton students are eligible to attend - except for prom (see p. 19).

**Big Brother/Big Sister** Seton Seniors are paired up with incoming 7<sup>th</sup> graders to help them transition into a new school with a helping hand from our Seniors. In addition to the year-long assistance from one of the seniors, Big Brother/Big Sister tries to host an event several times throughout the year.

**Blue Crab Bowl (BCB) Team:** (parent mentors Mr. Konstanty and Mrs. Kellogg) This is Seton's 15th year to field a team at BCB which is Virginia's regional competition of the National Ocean Sciences Bowl. At this academic quiz-bowl competition, students use a buzzer system to respond to questions on a wide variety of ocean topics from geology to maritime history and from biology to current events. Come enjoy the excitement of competing against other Virginia high school students as you respond to rapid-fire questions, and work collaboratively with your teammates to beat the clock. Seeking students with curiosity and a willingness to read and study training materials. You don't have to be a science whiz. We will prepare you for success. Meeting Dates: Weekly after school on day to be decided by team members, usually Wednesdays. Membership: Competition is open to 9th - 12th grade students. Must be available to travel to Virginia Institute of Marine Science (VIMS) on a Friday and Saturday in February. **DATE TBA.** Junior high students welcome to practice with the team and attend the competition as spectators.

**Choir:** (Miss Vicente) **TBA due to COVID** Last year choir met on Mondays after school in Faustina to prepare to sing for Mass on Mondays at All Saints and Fridays at Seton. All grades are welcome. Some lunchtime practices are scheduled.

**Comestone:** **Due to COVID restrictions, Comestone is on hold.** Comestone provides Junior High School students with a school-based social activity that encourages faith, fun, and refreshments! Open to all JHS students.

**Data Club:** (Mr. Linton and Mr. Hoffman). **TBA No new members at this time.** From last year: The Data Science Club practices "Artificial Intelligence", and in particular learns to design and train Deep Neural Networks. **National Honor Society (NHS):** (Mrs. Lucas and Mrs. Duran) The St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Chapter of the National Honor Society (NHS) is a student run service organization. Membership eligibility requires full-time status for sophomores, juniors or seniors who have a cumulative GPA of at least 92.5% from classes taken at Seton, no more than four demerits since the beginning of the current school year and no more than eight demerits during the previous year. Notification of eligibility takes place in February at which time students complete an application and schedule an interview with the NHS Faculty Council. Students selected on the basis of their scholarship, character, leadership and service record are formally inducted into the NHS in April. Membership requirements include tutoring, assisting with school functions, chairing an NHS sponsored event, supporting NHS work throughout the year and attending monthly meetings. Monthly meetings: the first Monday of the month on which school is in session following last bell in Aquinas (or Claude if Aquinas is not available).

**Sacred Life Club (SLC):** (Mrs. Kanazeh) Sophia Kanazeh, President. Sacred Life Club plans trips to pray outside of the abortion clinic and fundraise to help mothers in need of our support and charity.
