
FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, Mrs. CARROLL

the past a special plenary indulgence was available during the octave of All Souls Day (Nov.2-9) under the usual conditions for visiting a cemetery and praying for the deceased. The Vatican has extended this indulgence this year through the entire month of November. The "usual conditions" are receiving Holy Communion the same day, confession within a reasonable time before or after the day, praying for the Holy Father's intentions, and freedom of attachment to sins. SETON'S TRADITION: Seton students have traditionally made a pilgrimage to the nearby cemetery after the Monday Mass at All Saints. Since an all-school pilgrimage is not possible this year, the Seton senior class of 2021 will visit the cemetery during their religion classes on Monday, All Souls Day, and thus carry on the tradition.

2021 AP EXAM REGISTRATION UPDATE



We are so grateful to the generous sponsors and donors of the 20th Annual Colonel P. Memorial Golf Tournament recognized below! We took a leap of faith 20 years ago with the inaugural Colonel P. Golf Tournament in hopes of offsetting costs for a growing Athletics Program. From that first tournament at Prince William Golf Course where we had just under 100 golfers and profited \$5,000, we have been blessed the last three years with having to close our registration due to record numbers and made over \$20,000 each year!

Back in 2000, we had a few athletic teams break into the state tournament final four. Since then, we have won state championships in multiple sports! All this from a small independent Catholic School that depends on volunteer coaches, parents to transport teams to games, and renting practice and game venues. Certainly the proceeds and support from the golf tournament donors and sponsors have been a driving force in the overall success of the Seton Sports Program!

Your support of this year's golf tournament aids in offsetting the Athletic Department's basic no-frills operating expenses. As we are both a junior and senior high school, we field teams for up to three levels (Varsity, JV, and Jr. High) with a total of 11 varsity sports. That adds up to a lot of teams and considerable operating expenses. Additionally, our tournament honors Colonel Michael Pennefather by a modest scholarship awarded to a graduating senior boy and girl who strongly demonstrate their Faith in daily life, in athletics, and through service to the Seton community. Lastly, thanks to you, we are able to offset expenses for the rental of the Grizzley Sports Complex which allows our teams to have a much needed turf field venue for practices during late winter and early spring when other county fields are not available!

The goal of the Seton Sports Program is the formation of the entire person: body, mind, heart, and soul. At Seton, student athletes are trained and encouraged to commit themselves to God, family, academics, and athletics. The character formation that occurs during this process is of primary importance to the Seton Sports Program. Thank you very much for generously contributing to our 20th Annual Colonel P.
