

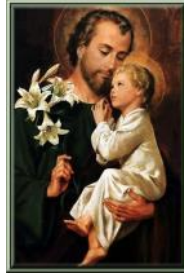

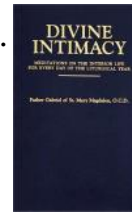

FURTHER THOUGHTS FOR ADVENT/CHRISTMAS

MEDITATION: During Advent, we meditate on Jesus’ threefold coming: At Christmas, at the End of the World, and to each of us individually in our hearts. The book *Divine Intimacy* by Father Gabriel of St. Mary Magdalene, O.C.D (highly recommended) offers another threefold view in a meditation for the second week of Advent. The meditation is entitled “Invitation to Divine Intimacy.”



First, we meditate on God’s presence in us through His act of causing and conserving our existence. God continually communicates His existence to us. Since “God is Love” (St. John the Beloved), all things are made of love, God’s love. Even the worst of sinners is held in existence by the love of God, and thus every human possesses “dignity beyond compare” (St. John Paul II), a dignity which must be respected.

But beyond this presence, God communicates His life itself through the indwelling of the Holy Trinity. “The three Persons of the Blessed Trinity are present in a soul in the state of grace to invite it to live in their society, in intimate friendship with them....God is within you...as the sweet Guest of your soul. . . .” St. Teresa of Avila: “If I had understood then as I do now that You dwell in this little palace of my soul, You who are so great a King, it seems to me I would not have left You alone so often, but would have kept you company from time to time and would have been more diligent to keep it spotless.”
