Religion: 4 credits are required for graduation.

Had Want

- ***Religion 9** – Basic doctrine and apologetics.
- ***Religion 10** – Christian morality and the sacraments (\$3 fee, Girls’ Rel. 10).
- ***Religion 11** – Sacred Scripture.
- ***Religion 12** – Prerequisite: 70+ in Religion 11 and L&L (students that don’t meet this prerequisite are required to take Mrs. Carroll’s 2-week summer school Religion 12 prep course). Advanced doctrine and apologetics, bioethics, marriage and the family, spiritual life (\$15 fee).
- Faith & Finance – Juniors and Seniors.** Practical life skills (New Evangelization, personal finance, job skills, the just society, personal spiritual life).

English: 6 credits are required for graduation.

- ***Grammar 9** –May test out (see Mrs. Mirus). If tests out, wants to take: 1) _____ or 2) _____
- ***English 9** – Literary genres, composition, speech.
- ***English 10** – Prerequisite: English 9. American literature, composition, vocabulary.
- ***Language & Logic –Juniors.** Grammar, vocabulary, and logic. **
- ***English 11** – Prerequisite: English 10. World literature, composition.
- ***English 12** – Prerequisite: English 11. British literature, composition, vocabulary.**
- Speech I** – Public speaking and debate.
- Writing for Publication –Grades 10-12.** Journalism, school newspaper, and creative writing for publication.

Social Studies: 3 credits are required including either American Hist or American Govt for students through the Class of 2024 – 4 credits are required (including American History AND American Govt) beginning with the Class of 2025.

Had Want

- World History–Freshman.** (Formally World History I & II) Ancient, medieval, and modern history.
- ***American History–Sophomores (Available for Juniors and Seniors in 2021-22).** Important American events. **
- World History II – (2021-22 will be the last year we offer this class)** Modern history from 1500.**
- History of the 20th Century Europe–Juniors.** (Formally World History III) 20th Century.
- ***American Government –Seniors Only.** History, structure, and workings of our American democratic republic and the application of Catholic social teaching. **
- Economics –Juniors and Seniors.** An introduction to the key concepts of micro and macroeconomics.**

Mathematics: 3 credits: Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra II are required, 4+ recommended. A 77%+ average is required in the previous level to proceed to the next level; students that receive below a 77% can complete remedial work during the summer, see Mr. Scheetz. Homeschooled math courses are required to take the Seton exam (see Mr. Scheetz) to receive credit.

Had Want

- ***Algebra I**—Prerequisite: Pre-Algebra or recommendation of instructor.
- ***Geometry**—Prerequisite: Algebra I (\$10 fee).
- ***Algebra II**—Prerequisite: Algebra I; Geometry recommended.
- Pre-Calculus and Analytic Geometry**—Prerequisites: Algebra II and Geometry.
- Calculus I** ** Prerequisite: Pre-Calculus.
- Calculus II** - Prerequisite: Calculus.
- Statistics Dual Enrollment (MTH245)** HS and 4 college credits. Prerequisites: Algebra II, Pre-Calculus, NOVA qualifying test scores, and a separate NOVA qualifying math exam. Calculus is strongly encouraged and can be taken concurrently.**

Science: 2 credits are required—3 credits are required beginning with the Class of 2023. 4+ recommended.

Had Want

- Earth and Space Science** –History and properties of the Earth, solar system, and the universe (\$25 lab fee).
- Biology** - Basic knowledge of life science and the principles of living systems (\$40 lab fee); **OR**
- Adv. Biology** – 85%+ in Physical Science and admission test required. See Mr. Hoffman (\$40 lab fee).
- Chemistry I** – Prerequisites: Biology, Algebra I & II (Algebra II may be taken concurrently). Physical Science recommended. Basics of atomic theory, the elements, unit conversions, chemical reactions in aqueous solutions, stoichiometry, chemical nomenclature, radioactive decay, and some energy related (\$35 lab fee).
- Chemistry II** –Prerequisite: Chemistry I and Algebra II. Continues study of chemical relationships (\$35 lab fee).
- Physics** – Prerequisite: Alg. II (may be concurrent), Matter, motion, energy and force, waves, sound, light, etc.
- Introduction to Engineering Dual Enrollment** (EGR121) HS and 2 college credits. Prerequisites: Physics, Chemistry, Calculus (may be taken concurrently), NOVA qualifying test scores, and a separate NOVA qualifying math exam. Advanced physics, engineering software, robotics (\$50 lab fee).
- Advanced Lab Sciences – Seniors Only.** Prerequisites: Biology and one other high school science. Forensic science, genetics, anatomy & physiology, environmental sciences (\$40 lab fee).
- Computers** – (does not count towards Science credit). Intro to computers: Microsoft Office Suite, development of typing skills, and proper identification of system hardware & peripherals. Completion of 2 semester-long projects (\$50 fee).

Foreign Languages: Students must take 3 years of Latin **OR** 1 year of Latin and at least 2 consecutive years of the same modern language. 3-4 years of the same language is recommended. A 77%+ average is required in the previous level to proceed to the next level of a language. Any of the following FL classes may not be offered if there is not enough interest.

- Art I** – Studio Art & Art Appreciation (\$45 fee).
- Art II** – Prerequisite: Art I. Full credit (5-day) studio art course (\$60 fee).
- Beginning Band**-No experience required; learn basic skills needed to read and perform band music in preparation for two concerts. Some instruments available for loan (see Miss Erwin). Instrument: _____ (\$20 fee).
- Intermediate Band** –Prerequisite: Minimum of one year of experience or director approval. Students improve skills in preparation for two concerts, Christmas and spring. Instrument: _____ (\$20 fee).
- Advanced Band** – Prerequisite: Minimum of two years of experience or director approval. Students will progress to higher levels of performance in preparation for two concerts, Christmas and spring (\$20 fee).
- Music Appreciation** – Students will learn music history, basic music terms & theory, & skills for active listening.
- Chorus I** – Students will sing popular, traditional, and sacred music in preparation for two concerts (\$20 fee).
- Chorus II** – Prerequisite: Chorus I, Students will improve overall musical skills/understanding (\$20 fee).
- Study Hall** – Silent study hall or placement in on-going class if study hall class not available. 1 per year permitted.
- Study Skills and Strategies** – Limited enrollment for select students. Pre-requisite: permission of Mrs. McCaa
