SOUP SUPPER AND STATIONS OF THE CROSS: I hope to see many of you at this annual Lenten event. Pray the stations with other members of the Seton community and share a meal. Please bring salad, bread, or fruit to share.

LENT WITH ST. JOSEPH, fourth installment: This week's excerpt from Fr. Philippe's book, *The Mystery of Joseph*, is from the section "Joseph's Trial." Before reading the excerpt, I suggest you read from Matthew's Gospel, Chapter 1, verses 18-24.

After the Visitation, when Mary is "found to be with child by the Holy Spirit," Joseph "decides to give Mary back her liberty....The Virgin belongs to God alone and God has every claim on her. In Joseph's resolution we see the divine love he has for Mary: he loves her for herself; he loves her in order that the will of God be fulfilled in her. He does not love her for himself; his love gives him no claim on her. Joseph wants to do the will of God above all else. ...he makes this heroic decision out of love for Mary and out of respect for her. But God has other plans. . . [The angel's message in his dream tells him that] she is given to him even more than before. . . He is to receive her in a more profound way, for he is to receive her in all her divine fruitfulness. . . He had surrendered everything to God and God rewards him a hundredfold. . . God gives him, through Mary, His own beloved Son to be his son also."
