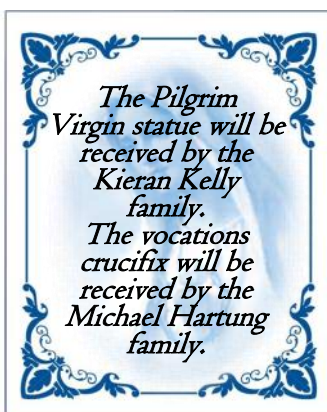

FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, MRS. CARROLL

ANNUAL ALL SOULS PILGRIMAGE TO THE CEMETERY: This year we are blessed to be able to have again our annual All Souls pilgrimage to the cemetery to pray for the Souls in Purgatory. The pilgrimage will take place on Monday, November 8, after the 8:30 AM Mass. We will all walk to the cemetery after Mass. Only those unable to walk should drive. Students will join their homeroom teachers and pray a decade of the Rosary, prayers for the Holy Father's intentions, and the "Eternal Rest..." prayer. We will then walk back to All Saints and return to school. The schedule will pick up at that time, probably near the end of first period. Praying for the souls in Purgatory during the octave of All Souls Day (November 2-9) gains a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions (confession within a week before or after, Holy Communion the same day, prayers for the Holy Father's intentions, and freedom from attachment to sins)

THE EUCHARIST AS COMMUNION

The fourth miracle is that the accidents continue to behave in exactly the same way as if the substances of bread and wine still existed. If a scientist were to put a consecrated Host under a microscope, he would see nothing different than if he put an unconsecrated Host in the same place. The accidents thus serve as a veil between us and the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ so that we can exercise the virtue of faith in believing in His true presence. These first four miracles remind us of the first great work of God outside of Himself; He causes things to be out of nothing and holds them in existence by one creative act. The next four miracles remind us of God's second great work of the Incarnation.

The fifth miracle is the existence of the Body and Blood of Christ under the appearances of bread and wine so that He is as truly present in the Eucharist as He is in heaven. Just as the Son of God became man in Mary's womb, while remaining at the Father's side, so too He becomes present on our altars while remaining in heaven.

The sixth miracle is that the human soul of our blessed Lord becomes present along with His Body. The priest says, "This is my body," but Our Lord's soul will never again be separated from His Body, as it was during the three days in the tomb; Christ is risen and will die no more. With His divine nature, He is eternally loving the Father in heaven; with His human intellect and will, He joins us in time to love and glorify the Father from His place on our altars and in our very bodies. We can unite our feeble praise with His infinite praise to give fitting worship to God.

The seventh miracle is the presence of Jesus' Divine Person on the altar. By virtue of the hypostatic union, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, the Word of God, is truly present with His Soul and Body. When the Incarnation took place, a human nature was elevated to union with a Divine Person. This union is permanent. When Jesus died on the cross, His Divine Person remained hypostatically united with both His Body and His Soul, so that His broken Body in the tomb was as worthy of adoration as His glorified Soul freeing the deceased faithful in Limbo. Now on the altar, we adore Jesus Christ, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity
