## FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, MRS. CARROLL



**ANNUAL ALL SOULS PILGRIMAGE TO THE CEMETERY:** This year we are blessed to be able to have again our annual All Souls pilgrimage to the cemetery to pray for the Souls in Purgatory. The pilgrimage will take place on Monday, November 8, after the 8:30 AM Mass. We will all walk to the cemetery after Mass. Only those unable to walk should drive. Students will join their homeroom teachers and pray a decade of the Rosary, prayers for the Holy Father's intentions, and the "Eternal Rest..." prayer. We will then walk back to All Saints and return to school. The schedule will pick up at that time, probably near the end of first period. Praying for the souls in Purgatory during the octave of All Souls Day (November 2-9) gains a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions (confession within a week before or after, Holy Communion the same day, prayers for the Holy Father's intentions, and freedom from attachment to sins)



**NOTE:** The plenary indulgence for a cemetery visit formerly applied to the Octave of All Souls. The Holy Father has now extended the indulgence to every day in November. Indulgences are a great spiritual power. They truly unite us with those we love who have gone before us into the next life. Let us take advantage of these special opportunities during the month of November, the month dedicated to the Poor Souls.



**TERZA MERIT AWARD:** The Terza Merit Award was established to honor long-time, beloved teacher, Richard Terza, who died in an automobile accident. The purpose of the award was to honor those students who exemplified the spirit of Mr. Terza: joyful, positive, charitable, faithful. The award is given several times during the school year, each time with a different theme. The awards this year focus on our virtue of the year, justice.

**INCREASING DEVOTION TO THE HOLY EUCHARIST:** Installment 3 of a meditation on the Eucharist, taken from an English theologian of the 19th century, Father Frederick Faber.

### THE EUCHARIST AS COMMUNION



The eighth miracle is the presence of the Blessed Trinity on our altars. By virtue of circuminsession, the Father and Holy Spirit are present along with the Son, just as they were present with Jesus Christ during His earthly existence. The great acts of generation and spiration occur as we gaze upon what appears to be only a tiny piece of bread.

The ninth miracle is the manner in which Our Lord's body is present under the accidents of bread and wine. He is present wholly and entirely in even the smallest particle of the Sacred Host or the tiniest drop of the Precious Blood. If a person has an allergy to wheat and must receive Holy Communion under the species of wine only, he still receives Jesus entirely. If Hosts must be broken because of the large number of communicants, the faithful still receive Jesus entirely. Thus we must treat with great reverence even the smallest particle of the consecrated Host and the smallest drop of the consecrated Wine.

The tenth miracle is the multiplicity of His presence. No matter how many Masses are being said at the same time, Jesus is truly present in each one. He is present just as truly in an army field Mass said on the hood of a jeep as He is present on the high altar of St. Peter's when the Pope celebrates Mass. On an early morning at St. Peter's, priests are saying Masses at altars throughout the basilica. Jesus is present, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, at each one. This miracle reminds us of the third great work of God, Justification. Just as Jesus Christ pours out the grace of justification from the cross to every soul who ever has lived or ever will live, so He multiplies His presence on all the altars of the world.


