ASH WEDNESDAY MEDITATION: "Remember man that you are dust and unto dust you shall return." These are the words we hear on Ash Wednesday as our foreheads are signed with ashes in the shape of a cross. The ashes represent the dust to which we shall return. Ashes (dust) have no substance. The lightest breath will disperse them. They are a good example of man's nothingness. We are drawn from nothing by God's creative power, by His infinite love. To be united with Him forever, we must pass through the dark reality of death. Jesus, by dying Himself, gives us the strength to accept death out of love for Him. Ashes should help us see the vanity of earthly things and the brevity of life. In the words of St. Teresa of Avila, "All things are passing. God never changes." We learn to detach from earthly things, so that we can make proper use of them for the honor and glory of God and the good of others and to fulfill the daily duties of our state in life. Only love and fidelity to God are of value for eternity. In the end we will be judged on love.
