## What is a SMART Goal?

'SMART' is an acronym that stands for Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, and Timely. SMART goals meet all 5 of these criteria — and, as a result, are strategic, focused, and attainable. Why use SMART goals? When you use the SMART goal framework, you rid yourself of confusion and gain clarity. Setting a SMART goal will help you understand exactly what you need to do (and when you need to do it) to achieve your desired outcome. What are examples of using a SMART goal? Students can use SMART goals to improve grades, complete a class project, become better at a sport or playing a musical instrument, etc. For example, let's say you would like to improve a grade in a particular class. Your SMART goal could look something like this:

- **Specific**: I want to get above an 85 in my math class.
- **Measurable**: I will complete all my homework assignments; ask for help if I need it; and study for tests with a helpful friend.
- **Achievable**: I know I can do better in math if I try harder.
- **Relevant**: If I can improve my grade in math, it will help me get into college.
- **Timely**: I will begin at the beginning of the new quarter and will have eight weeks to improve my grade.

Ave Maria University (AMU) was founded by former Domino's Pizza owner Tom Monaghan in 2003 as a direct response to Pope St. John Paul II's call for a new evangelization.

The University offers 34 undergraduate majors, with programs in the humanities, the sciences (e.g., marine biology, biology, biochemistry, chemistry, physics, exercise physiology, environmental science), psychology, music, communications, nursing, business, and education. The most popular majors are biology, exercise physiology, biochemistry, communications, business, psychology, and theology.

More than 60 student clubs, organizations, ministries, outreach efforts, and households offer an abundance of activities to include swing dance, rugby, equestrian, scuba, film, drama, and debate.

Students also have opportunities to serve on mission trips with sisters from the Missionaries of Charity in Calcutta, Uganda, Haiti, Dominican Republic, Guatemala City, Mexico City, Washington DC and New York City.
