The First Step to Finding the Money You Need for College: Completing the FAFSA

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the single most important thing students can do to get money to help pay for college. Colleges and universities use the FAFSA to determine eligibility for federal, state, and college-sponsored financial aid including grants, scholarships, educational loans, and work-study programs. Therefore, even though the FAFSA is technically the application for federal aid, students still have to fill it out to receive state and college-sponsored financial aid as well.

Don't forget, the federal government and many states award financial aid on a first-come, first-serve basis, so it is wise to submit the form sooner than later. Also, no matter what your financial situation, you are encouraged to complete the FAFSA. You can access the application here: studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa

Cardinal Newman Society - Recommended Catholic Colleges

Over the next several weeks, the Seton Guidance Corner will highlight a recommended college by the Cardinal Newman Society. This week's feature is **Christendom College**.

Year Founded: 1977 Location: Front Royal, VA Number of Students: 539 Number of Majors: 7

Christendom College was founded by Dr. Warren Carroll in 1977 as an alternative to secular trends in Catholic higher education. What was then a little-known secret in the Blue Ridge Mountains of Virginia is now a national model of faithful liberal arts education and Catholic formation.

Christendom provides a liberal arts education with an extensive, 86-credit core curriculum, including six Catholic theology and six philosophy courses. Students can also concentrate in seven majors and earn B.A. degrees in Classics, English, History, Philosophy, Mathematics, Political Science and Economics, and Theology as well as M.A. degrees in Theological Studies. Many students study a semester in Rome, continuing their core courses in residences just 30 minutes from St. Peter's Basilica.

There are nearly 30 clubs and activities including choir, drama, writing, boxing, debate, swing dance, tennis, and swimming. In addition, there are 10 varsity sport teams and intramurals.

Class time is set aside daily for Mass, and students have access to daily Confession, Adoration, Rosary, and Liturgy of the Hours. Feast days are often marked with special celebrations. Many alumni have found religious vocations, including more than 100 priests.
