Cardinal Newman Society – Recommended Catholic Colleges

Over the next several weeks, the Seton Guidance Corner will highlight a recommended college by the Cardinal Newman Society. This week's feature is **Thomas Aquinas College**.

Year Founded: 1971 & 2019 Two Locations: Santa Paula, CA & Northfield, MA

Thomas Aquinas College (TAC) was founded in 1971 by Catholic professors devoted to the Catholic faith and study of original writings by the greatest minds of Western culture. The campus nestled in the hills east of Los Angeles capped enrollment to preserve the small-college environment. However, faced with growing interest, a second campus was opened in the hills of Northfield, Massachusetts, in 2019.

There are no majors, no academic departments, no textbooks, and no lectures. TAC is unique among American colleges and universities offering a faithfully Catholic education comprised entirely of the Great Books and classroom discussions. All students progress through the same liberal arts degree which is roughly equivalent to a double major in theology and philosophy and a minor in mathematics.

Students can choose from a number of extracurricular activities offered in both music and theater programs. Sports programs include soccer, basketball, volleyball, and ultimate Frisbee. Both campus locations offer options for many outdoor activities—hiking and skiing in New England and hiking and beaches in California.

Nearly all students are Catholic and enjoy a strong spiritual life on campus, including daily Mass when classes are not scheduled and Extraordinary Form Mass on most days. There is daily Confession, Rosary, and Liturgy of the Hours. More than 10 percent of alumni have entered religious life.
