Located in the heart of Houston, Texas, the University of St. Thomas was launched in 1947 by the Basilian Fathers, who still own it today. The University boasts a solid liberal arts foundation and career preparation that is faithful to Catholic teaching.

St. Thomas offers more than 40 undergraduate majors to include medicine, education, business, and public administration. The University's comprehensive, liberal arts core curriculum includes three Catholic theology and three philosophy courses.

Student life at St. Thomas is filled with events, activities, clubs, and leadership opportunities. Clubs and activities include the Debate Club, Investment Club, Computer Science Club, Nursing Club, Chess, Fencing, and Soccer. St. Thomas recently joined the Southern Collegiate conference of the NCAA Division III with 19 varsity sports.
