Courses marked \*\* have a corresponding AP test you may take with extra preparation. Estimated course fees are marked for planning purposes only and may change; do NOT pay fees now. **Next to all elective courses, indicate your choice order (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, etc) and any additional info necessary to ensure we understand what you want.** Parent signature required.

**Religion:** 4 credits are required. Religion 11 & 12 must be taken at Seton. (Class fees are estimates only.)

Had Want

- \***Religion 9** – Basic doctrine and apologetics.
- \***Religion 10** – Christian morality and the sacraments (\$3 fee, Girls’ Rel. 10).
- \***Religion 11** – Sacred Scripture (\$5 fee).
- \***Religion 12** – Prerequisite: 70+ in Rel 11 and L&L (students that don’t qualify are required to take Mrs. Carroll’s 2-week summer school course). Adv doctrine and apologetics, bioethics, marriage & family, spiritual life (\$20 fee).
- choice   **Faith & Finance – Juniors and Seniors; Sophomores** (with permission from Mrs. Ciskanik). The New Evangelization, living an apostolic life, foundations of the spiritual life, SMART goals, budgeting, wealth, loans, credit, investments, taxes. Midterm and Final projects in place of exams.
- choice   **TOB & St Paul – Juniors and Seniors.** Theology of the Body and St. Paul, the man and his message.

**English:** 6 credits are required. Language & Logic and English 12 must be taken at Seton.

Had Want

- \***Grammar 9** –May test out (test will only be offered to those students that received a 93+ in Grammar 7 or Grammar 8).
- \***English 9** – Literary genres, composition, speech.
- \***English 10** – Prerequisite: English 9. American literature, composition, vocabulary.
- \***Language & Logic –Juniors.** Grammar, vocabulary, and logic. \*\*
- \***English 11** – Prerequisite: English 10. World literature, composition.
- \***English 12 DE (ENG 111/112)** – HS and 6 college credits. Prerequisite: English 11, NOVA qualifying test scores. College-level composition, British literature. \*\*  I do NOT want DE. If checked, explain \_\_\_\_\_
- choice   **Speech I** – Public speaking and debate.
- choice   **Writing for Publication –Grades 10-12.** Journalism, school newspaper, and creative writing for publication.

**Social Studies:** 3 credits are required including either American Hist or American Govt for students through the Class of 2024 – 4 credits are required (including American History AND American Govt) beginning with the Class of 2025.

Had Want

- World History–Freshman.** Ancient, medieval, and modern history.
- \***American History–Sophomores.** Important American events. \*\*
- History of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century–Juniors.** 20<sup>th</sup> Century.
- Economics –Juniors and Seniors.** An introduction to the key concepts of micro and macroeconomics.\*\*
- \***American Government –Seniors Only.** History, structure, and workings of our American democratic republic and the application of Catholic social teaching.\*\*

**Mathematics:** 3 credits: Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra II are required, 4+ recommended. A 70%+ average is required in the previous level to proceed to the next level. (Class fees are estimates only.)

Had Want

- \***Algebra I**—Prerequisite: Pre-Algebra or recommendation of instructor.
- \***Geometry**—Prerequisite: Algebra I (\$10 fee).
- \***Algebra II**—Prerequisite: Algebra I; Geometry recommended.
- Pre-Calculus and Analytic Geometry**—Prerequisites: Algebra II and Geometry.
- Calculus I** - Prerequisite: Pre-Calculus. \*\*
- Calculus II** - Prerequisite: Calculus.
- Statistics DE (MTH245)** HS and 3 college credits. Prerequisites: Pre-Calculus and qualifying math test scores. Calculus is strongly encouraged and can be taken concurrently.\*\*

**Science:** 3 credits are required. 4+ recommended. All classes include lab. (Class fees are estimates only.)

Had Want

- Earth and Space Science** –History and properties of the Earth, solar system, and the universe (\$25 lab fee).  
 choice
- Biology** - Basic knowledge of life science and the principles of living systems (\$40 lab fee); **OR**  
 choice
- Adv. Biology** – 85%+ in Physical Science and admission test required. See Mr. Hoffman (\$40 lab fee).  
 choice
- Chemistry I** – Prerequisites: Biology, Algebra I & II (Algebra II may be taken concurrently). Physical Science recommended. Basics of atomic theory, the elements, unit conversions, chemical reactions in aqueous solutions, stoichiometry, chemical nomenclature, radioactive decay, and some energy related (\$35 lab fee). \*\*  
 choice
- Chemistry II** –Prerequisite: Chemistry I and Algebra II. Continues study of chemical relationships (\$35 lab fee).  
 choice
- Physics** – Prerequisite: Alg. II (may be concurrent), Matter, motion, energy and force, waves, sound, light, etc.  
 choice
- Introduction to Engineering DE** (EGR121) HS and 2 college credits. Prerequisites: Physics, Chemistry, Calculus (may be taken concurrently), NOVA qualifying test scores, and a separate NOVA qualifying math exam. Advanced physics, engineering software, robotics (\$50 lab fee).  
 choice
- Advanced Lab Sciences – Seniors Only.** Prerequisites: Biology and one other high school science. Forensic science, genetics, anatomy & physiology, environmental sciences (\$40 lab fee).  
 choice

**Science Electives that do not count towards science credit:**

- Information Technology** –Intro to computers: Microsoft Office Suite, development of typing skills, understanding system hardware & peripherals, basics of video editing and production, cyber security, online safety. (\$50 fee)  
 choice
- Python** - ½ Credit. Offered 1<sup>st</sup> Semester. Computer programming course for logical thinking students. Approval from HS math teacher. Limited to 8 students.  
 choice
- 3D Printing** –½ Credit. Offered 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester. Introductory course in 3-Dimensional printing. Limited to 8 students.  
 choice

**Foreign Languages:** Students are required to take Latin I and two consecutive years of the same modern language **OR** Latin I and II, plus either Latin III or another language. 3 credits required but 4 years is strongly recommended. A 75%+ average is required in the previous level to proceed to the next level of a language.

Had Want

- Art I** – Studio Art & Art Appreciation (\$45 fee).  
 choice
- Art II** – Prerequisite: Art I. Full credit (5-day) studio art course (\$60 fee).  
 choice
- Beginning Band**–No experience required; learn basic skills needed to read and perform band music in preparation for two concerts. Some instruments available for loan (see Miss Erwin). Instrument: \_\_\_\_\_ (\$20 fee).  
 choice
- Intermediate Band** –Prerequisite: Minimum of one year of experience or director approval. Students improve skills in preparation for two concerts, Christmas and spring. Instrument: \_\_\_\_\_ (\$20 fee).  
 choice
- Advanced Band** – Prerequisite: Minimum of two years of experience or director approval. Students will progress to higher levels of performance in preparation for two concerts, Christmas and spring (\$20 fee).  
 choice
- Chorus I**– Students will sing popular, traditional, and sacred music in preparation for two concerts (\$20 fee).  
 choice
- Chorus II** – Prerequisite: Chorus I, Students will improve overall musical skills/understanding (\$20 fee).  
 choice
- Seton Chamber Choir** –Audition required. ½ Credit. Practice is afterschool and/or during lunch (see Miss Vicente).  
 choice
- Study Hall** – Silent study hall or placement in an on-going class if permanent study hall class not available. No credit is given. Students may be asked to help around the school when necessary. 1 per year is permitted.
