

MEDITATION FOR THE SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT on the Gospel of the Transfiguration, from Divine Intimacy:

Spiritual consolations are never an end in themselves. . . God does not console us for our entertainment but rather for our encouragement, for our strengthening, for the increase of our generosity in suffering for love of Him. The vision disappeared; the Apostles raised their eyes and saw nothing save Jesus alone, and with Jesus alone, they came down from the mountain. This is what we must always seek, and it must be sufficient for us: Jesus alone, God alone. Everything else—consolations, helps, friend-ships, understanding, esteem, encouragement—may be good to the extent that God permits us to enjoy them. [But if these are taken away, it is so that] we may prove to God more than ever. . .that He is our All and that He alone suffices.
