Seton Teachers will be presenting awards in all the classes, but for non-8th and 12th graders the awards will be given in the class during a school day or right after exams.

8th Grade Awards and Graduation, Thursday, June 1, 7 PM. The night will have class awards (as in the past), but will focus on those graduating from middle school. The awards will be followed by eighth grade graduation. Some exceptions will be made for special 7th grade awards. Dress code is Out of Uniform Dress. We would like to see the students in their Sunday best. Boys must have dress shirt, dress pants, dress shoes and a tie. Girls must have skirts that cover all or most of the knee when sitting (they will be in the front of the room). No strapless or spaghetti strap dresses, even with a jacket or sweater. Students who are not in dress code will not be allowed to participate in the graduation. We want our students to look their best as we honor their achievements.

Senior Awards Night, Friday, June 2, 7 PM. The High School Awards night will focus class awards on the graduating seniors only. It will also include all special awards that have been traditionally awarded culminating with Mr. and Mrs. Seton. As with the 8th grade awards, outstanding accomplishments of underclassmen will be recognized and those particular students will be notified by his/her teacher. It is our hope that those underclassmen will also attend the awards night whether or not they have a senior sibling in order to be recognized by the community. Mary scored the game at 1:00 points, only needing one more point, but not all of us were of her class she was heading 2000 points after landing a three pointer in the first quarter of the game. Mary never realized she had passed the 2000 point mark after scoring, and hearing the cheering crowd. Mary has been an expert in her basketball team at Seton School since she started playing "her" after her first season. She's a dedicated player. "Mary really shows the qualities of a well-rounded basketball player and believes that the secret to accomplishing great things as a player is to play as a team. "Mary was named "the best basketball player" in the school's yearbook, always aims for the greater good of the team, sets a good example, never slacks, and is an

award-winning player. The record stands for working at the things you love!"
