GRATITUDE IV FAMILY SPIRITUAL PREPARATION FOR THE GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY: The following quote from

"Divine Intimacy" (Meditation 283) might be a good topic for a family conversation on gratitude towards God. Even younger children can understand this concept: "Incapable as we are of paying our debts to God according to justice, we should at

least try to supply for them by our gratitude. . . We have nothing of our own; all that we are and have comes from Him, and in return for His infinite generosity, we can do nothing but use His gifts to express our gratitude to Him. 'In all things give thanks, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you all' (Thes 5:18)."



INTELLECTUAL FORMATION: Here is the next take-away from The Battle for the American Mind. Chapter 3, "The Forgotten Force of Western Christian Education". In this chapter the author introduces the concept of paideia, a Greek word that is difficult to translate. Paideia re-PETE HEGSETH fers to the dominant philosophical, religious, moral, and political ideas in a society. These ideas create the culture of a society, influencing all

areas of life. For this book, the main area of concern is education. If a paideia is formed by true concepts of the nature of the human person, of the relationship between humans and God, and of the moral values that promote human flourishing, the home and the schools will form children who will know what is truly good, true, and beautiful. Until a century ago, our society and the schools in them were built on the Western Christian Paideia. The author does not refer to Catholic schools, but they were built on the Western Catholic Paideia, so they had even more to offer the children they educated, namely the fullness of revelation, most especially the Sacraments. 


