Mission Statement

Seton Junior-Senior High School is an accredited, private, co-educational school operated by Catholic laymen dedicated to promoting the established tradition of Catholic secondary education. In cooperation with our parents, the primary educators of their children, the faculty and staff of Seton School profess a threefold educational mission to:

The School

Seton School, founded in 1975, stresses high academic standards and high standards of conduct, close cooperation with parents, and a multitude of activities available to all students. The student population is approximately 365 in grades seven through twelve. Seton School is on the Catholic Education Honor Roll, which is sponsored by the Cardinal Newman Society, based on academic excellence, Catholic identity, and civic education.

Curriculum/ Grading Scale

Seton School requires its students to complete a rigorous course of studies designed to prepare them to succeed in challenging college coursework. Included in this curriculum are several college-level courses that, while not official AP courses, consistently enable the students to take AP exams in the areas of Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Computer Science, English Language and Literature, European History, Latin, US Government, US History, and Physics with success. An average of 25% of the graduating seniors in the classes of 2019-2023 took one or more AP exams during their years at Seton School. 70% of exams taken in 2022 and 2023 received scores of 3 or higher.

Transcripts display the percentage received for each class on a 100-point scale. The cumulative GPA is calculated by averaging each Seton High School class taken on a 4-point scale. If a student took a Seton summer school remedial class, that class is listed separately, and the cumulative GPA includes the average of the grade received in the summer with the grade received at the end of the year. All classes carry the same weight for GPA purposes. A passing grade is a 65. Seton does not rank except for first and second in the class. Audited classes require students to attend and participate in class, but no credit or grade is given.

Information Regarding COVID-19

On March 16, 2020, Seton responded to the COVID-19 Coronavirus pandemic by immediately moving to an online environment. Teachers held synchronous classes online to foster active learning as well as taped lectures and discussions for asynchronous learning. Students were held to the same standards of academic excellence and grades were recorded and calculated for the remainder of the school year consistent with previous academic quarters. On August 26, 2020, Seton re-opened for the 2020-2021 school year and has remained opened since operating fully with in-person classes 5 days a week.




