CLT - The New Standard for College Entrance Exams

While the SAT and ACT are designed to reflect public school curricula, specifically the Common Core State Standards framework, the CLT is different and considers student intellectual capacity and aptitude, making it a better fit for students from a variety of educational backgrounds. CLT also uses meaningful pieces of literature for its reading passages. The CLT is an online college entrance exam for 11th and 12th graders and is accepted at hundreds of colleges across the U.S. In September 2023, the state of Florida approved the CLT for all of its public universities. Many Cardinal Newman recommended colleges accept the CLT and offer scholarships based on scores including Christendom College, Benedictine College, and Franciscan University. Seniors, 4 Things to Remember Before Submitting Your Applications

Ask Yourself: Would I Even Go There if Admitted? - When applying to schools, it's easy to push off refining your college list until decisions come out, but realistically, the sooner you make those tough choices, the better. Why? College applications take time and money, and there are probably not that many schools that you can truly imagine yourself attending.

Remember to Read Your Writings Out Loud - You'll want to finish and upload your applications so you can feel a sense of accomplishment. But before submitting, read your written portions out loud to catch any errors that may be lingering.

Remember to Breathe - Applying to college can be a lot to handle, so don't let it consume you.

Remember That a Negative Decision Won't Ruin Your Life - When applying to college, most students think an unfavorable decision means their self-worth as a person and a student will decrease. That couldn't be further from the truth. Your success is not dependent on where you go.

Advantages of the Advanced Placement (AP) Program

The AP Program is designed by the College Board to provide motivated and academically prepared high school students in 10th, 11th or 12th grade with the opportunity to study and learn at the college level with the potential to reduce college costs. The two components of the program are AP courses and AP exams. Although Seton does not offer AP courses, students do have the opportunity to take the AP exams. AP exams are scored on a 5-point scale, and a score of 3 or higher corresponds to a passing grade in a comparable college course. Most colleges and universities will grant college credit and/or advanced placement for successful AP exam scores (consult individual colleges for their policies). Earning college credit or advanced placement can allow students more flexibility to double major, study abroad, or graduate early. Participating in the AP Program can also help students to stand out in the college admissions process.
