MESSAGE FROM AN ALUMNA: Sister Auriesville (Jean Pennefather, Class of 1989, sister of Mr. P. and Mr. Pennefather) reports that her religious family has the only Catholic parish in Gaza and the situation there is very serious. She adds, "We recently learned from

our Provincial Superior in the Middle East that there are thousands of people who are suffering from wounds due to the bombings in the war in Gaza and many of them have received no medical care. Also, we have priests and sisters in Ukraine and the Russians have recently taken over our church." Sister asks for your prayers for all those who are suffering and for those who are ministering to them. In a more recent email, Sister adds the following: " About Gaza, I have asked my superior to send you a link at least to a



video of their First Communions there! What a beautiful witness and mystery! A handful of kids receiving First Communion in the middle of a war, in a place where hundreds of people are taking refuge and the bombs can still be heard nearby." 
