

GRATITUDE I: For the Year of Prayer proclaimed by Pope Francis in preparation for the Jubilee Year of 2025. We should be inspired to deepen our individual prayer life as well as that of our families and our school. For

It's important that we not look upon this opportunity as a requirement to say more prayers. Rather we should begin by making whatever prayers we say more intentional. Think about the words we are saying. Think about the intentions we are praying for.

GRATITUDE II: to the National Honor Society and their faculty adviser Mrs. Lucas for raising over \$2,100 to donate to the Medical Missionaries to benefit mothers and infants.

GRATITUDE III: For the PRO Board and President Maria Hartung for all that they do to support the teachers, students, and Seton's mission.

FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION: Tomorrow, February 2, 40 days after Christmas, we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation. According to the Mosaic Law, parents would bring their firstborn sons to the Temple 40 after birth to present

him to God. This offering commemorated the saving of the firstborn Jewish sons during the 10 Plague in Egypt. Now the perfect firstborn Son is offered to the Father, ever after eliminating the need to offer first born sons.

The Eastern Churches call this event Meeting—the meeting between the representative of the Old Covenant (Simeon) and the New Covenant (Jesus Christ). We thus see the Old Law ending and the New Law beginning. Simeon and Anna, the aged man

and woman, represent the hopes of Judaism now rewarded by seeing the Messiah. Simeon and Anna had waited a long time. What if they had given up on God and left before Jesus came? They would never have seen Him. We must never lose patience with God, but trust that His plan will be fulfilled at the best time. In Simeon's canticle, the Nunc Dimittis ("Now, Master, you can dismiss your servant in peace"), Simeon praises the child as a light to the Gentiles and the glory of the people of Israel; showing the universality of the mission of the Messiah. We also have Simeon's prophecy of the opposition that the Messiah will face as a "sign of contradiction," and the prophecy of the sword that will pierce Mary's heart, the first of her 7 sorrows. In the words of Pope Benedict XVI, redemption "comes at a price: the anguish of the Cross. The prophecy of light and that of the Cross belong together." Like Simeon, we will meet Jesus today, through Mass, through prayer, and through everyone we encounter. May our meeting with Him be particularly intimate and sanctifying.

Blessed Sacrament, a Rosary and words to help us have a fruitful Lenten season.


