

# SETON TRACK SCORES ITS FIRST POINTS IN A MEET IN OVER 30 YEARS!

Yesterday at St John Paul the Great, the Seton 4x800 relay team accomplished two new firsts: with their 2nd place finish, they scored 8 pts for the team, the first points we have scored so far since the renewal of Seton Track, and they got the first VISAA State Qualifying time, with a time of 9:34.00. The relay team of Patrick Kay (2:27), Dan Jackson (2:26), Daniel Hurley (2:25) and Peter Konstanty (2:16) came in well ahead of the qualifying time of 10:28 and supplied the first highlight of the meet. Daniel Hurley and Patrick Kay competed in their first-ever meets. Daniel ran 13.89 in the 100m and 28.16 in the 200m. Patrick was the longest distance runner, as he ran the 400m in 1:11.15 and the

was the longest distance runner, as he 1600m in 5:38.23. Dan Jackson competed in the 400m, with a time of 1:03.58. Peter Konstanty ran 26.23 in the 200m and 5:34.82 in the 1600m. All in all, the boys had a great time and left quite happy and exhausted. Click on the image for the results.
