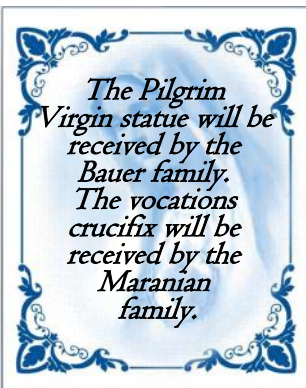

- ✦ Mass is at 9:00 AM in the Shrine basilica. The celebrant is Father Isenberg.
- ✦ On the way to the Shrine, please pray the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary.
- ✦ After Mass, we will pray the Luminous Mysteries.
- ✦ Then we will go to the nearby picnic grounds for brunch/lunch, games and socializing.
- ✦ Around 12:30-12:45, we will go to the Stations of the Cross at the Shrine to pray the Sorrowful Mysteries.
- ✦ After that, families are free to enjoy the beauty of the Shrine grounds and return home at the time of their choice. Please say the Glorious Mysteries on the way home.



Dress appropriately for Mass. You may bring casual but modest clothes for the picnic. Bring a picnic for your family and sports equipment (if desired). We invite families who cannot come to the Shrine to please join us in spirit by saying at least one Rosary for the intentions of the Pilgrimage.

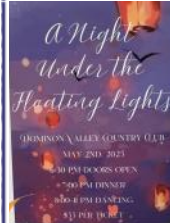

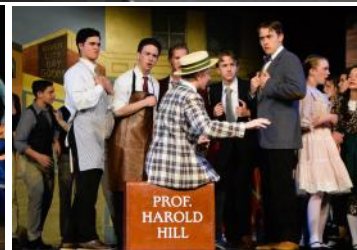
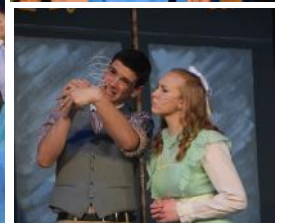
